# The Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends,

Statisticians tells us that many New Year's Resolutions fail. So instead of making New Year's resolutions that fail, I have chosen to begin each year by selecting a word to reflect on for the entire year. The word that I choose becomes a word that I think about and try to integrate into all that I am doing and all that is happening in my life.

It's a great American tradition to do this. Ben Franklin as a young man used to chart his progress weekly in exhibiting a number of values that he thought were important such as humility, temperance, order, and industry. Similarly, George Washington reflected on a list of virtues that he thought would make him a better person as he grew older and they did. Washington often used his list to control a fierce temper.

This year, I will be focusing on the word "gratitude." Gratitude is something that preachers tend to talk about only at Thanksgiving time. However, I think that in 2015, I want to make gratitude a more important part of my daily life.

At this time of year we are bombarded with thoughts of all the things that are wrong with us. Do we need to lose some weight? Are we as good-looking as we would like to be? What I want to suggest is that instead we might take the time this year to focus on not what is missing in our lives but what is present.

A number of years ago, the author Spencer Johnson talked about what he called "the precious present." It was not a gift in a traditional sense like a Christmas present or birthday gift but rather it was the ability to focus on the here and now and not be overly concerned about the future or trapped in the past. Instead, he suggested that people have the courage to live in the precious present.

I want to daily ask myself the question: What am I grateful to God for today? Who is teaching me something new or surprising me with a beautiful moment. Long ago the Psalmist wrote: "This is the day that the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118). That's good advice for 2015.

May God be with you and those that you love in this New Year and may God fill our hearts with gratitude. I'll see you in Church.

#### How To Express Appreciation for Others

The season between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day is the time when many people experience the love and appreciation of others. In turn, it is time when our care and compassion is offered to our families and our friends and those in need. But wouldn't it be great to experience that level of joy and appreciation everyday of the year?

How can we begin to express our appreciation for others? We can begin by making expressing gratitude a habit – a regular part of our daily lives. Expressing appreciation on a daily basis will provide multiple health benefits and helps us live longer.

For your appreciation to hit the mark, keep in mind that there are three different kinds of appreciation – auditory, visual, and kinesthetic. These are three ways that our brain takes in information. With a little practice, it's easy to match the type of appreciation with the person you wish to honor.

Auditory people like to hear appreciation. Expressing thanks verbally is the best way to let people know how much we appreciate them. Auditory people can be sensitive to the tone that we use in thanking them. Speaking in a caring voice can be helpful.

Visual people like to receive things that they can see. Flowers or an attractive card or a picture are perfect ways to honor people who approach life like it's a movie.

Kinestic people like to feel appreciated with the emphasis on feelings. Sometimes a hug or a slap on the back or a fist bump can communicate to a person the strong feelings of appreciation that you might have.

As we begin to build the habit of appreciation, it helps to always look for new people to whom we can express appreciation. Each day brings new opportunities to appreciate others. We all know that we literally could not survive without the help of other people. No one pumps their own gas in New Jersey. The food we eat is produced through the efforts of many people before it gets to our tables. There are countless others who serve us in significant ways by doing their part in keeping our world functioning. Whenever possible, they deserve our thanks. Our community improves when we take the time to say thanks and make it a habit of appreciating the good that others do.

#### A Future with Hope Mission Fund Campaign Continues

The second anniversary of Hurricane Sandy marked a significant day in the history of a Future with Hope, Inc. The Future with Hope, Inc. is the non-profit that was organized by the Greater New Jersey Conference to help rebuild the Jersey Shore. On that day, the long-term recovery organization announced that it had completed the rebuilding or restoration of its 100<sup>th</sup> home. A Future with Hope, Inc., has involved over 8,500 volunteers and has a goal of rebuilding between 300 and 500 homes that were damaged by the storm.

On October 29, 2014, Chad and Angie Lorenzo and their children were joined by New Jersey First Lady Pat Christie and Bishop John Schol to celebrate the completion of their newly restored home in Toms River and to send out a reminder that there are still thousand more people who have not returned to their homes. Over 100 vounteers worked on the Lorenzo home with some coming from as far away as Nebraska. The volunteers performed approximately 2,300 hours of construction work.

How can we help? By making a contribution to The Future with Hope Mission Fund, we can help bring other families back to a normal life. During the first year of this 3 year campaign, our members and friends pledged over \$2,175.00. At the end of 2014, our congregation has contributed over \$2,933.00 to the Fund. 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#### District- wide celebration of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of UMCOR Sunday, March 15, 2015 ~ 11 am at Asbury UMC in Atlantic City.

On March 15 at Asbury UMC in Atlantic City, the Cape Atlantic District will host a celebration of the 75th Anniversary of UMCOR. It was 75 years ago this year when the United Methodist Committee on Relief was born in what is now Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City. Methodist Bishop Herbert T. Welch rose on the floor of the General Conference of 1940 and called for the creation of an organization that would be "a voice of conscience" among Methodists. From that one moment UMCOR was born. Today it works in over 80 countries around the world providing emergency assistance in times of disaster, supports sustainable agriculture programs in developing countries, and assists refugees who are fleeing from violence and persecution. Bishop John Schol, District Superintendent Brian Roberts, and UMCOR CEO Rev. Dr. Denise Honeycutt will be participating.



#### Mission Projects Results

The figures are in! During 2014 our Church provided outreach to the following organizations:

- 12 Backpacks filled with school supplies were provided to boys and girls of Glenwood Elementary School in Wildwood.
- 12 gift cards of \$25 each were provided to the children of Glenwood Avenue Elementary School for sneakers or shoes.
- Over 1,450 boxes of groceries were packed which provided a complete Thanksgiving Meal for needy families on Thanksgiving through Make a Difference Day in October.
- Four homeless families were provided a meal and a place to stay through Family Promise.
- Over 35 adults and older youth served as teachers, assistant teachers, and counselors along with one Ark-builder as part of the Workshop of Wonders Vacation Bible School 2014.
- Two families who wouldn't have had much of a Christmas received many Christmas gifts through our Church's Giving Tree program.
- 4 families received a Walmart Gift Card to help with their Christmas shopping this year in partnership with Caring for Kids.
- 7 families were supported with crisis and family counseling, which was provided through our partnership with Bridge Wellness Services and the GNJ Conference Board of Church and Society Peace with Justice.
