Dear Friends.

When I was a small boy I used to think a lot about time travel. One of my favorite books was "A Wrinkle in Time" by Madeline L'Engle. The book told the story of a young boy who could travel through time. Thinking about time travel got me thinking that, for me, one of the most fun aspects of the 125th Anniversary celebration has been the ability to, in a small way, go back in time. In the Fellowship Hall there are pictures of our church in mission and ministry over the past 25-30 years. These pictures tell the story of our church in action and we honor the people in those pictures for their contribution to that story. These pictures, lovingly put together by Martha Richardson, will be displayed until the end of October.

Several of the pictures show the placing of the steeple on our church. Those who were instrumental in the building of this Church believed that the steeple would act as a beacon. The steeple, once it was properly lighted, would lead others to a better way of life - a life of faith and a life that offers hope to those in need.

Over the past 25 years, the steeple has grown weathered, cracked, and it also leaks. Our Trustees have decided to repair and restore our steeple so that it can continue to shine outward in our community and call others to God in Jesus Christ. We will be creating a **Steeple Restoration Fund** which will allow us to maintain this symbol of our outreach to the community and to the world.

Why do we reach out to others in this way? Perhaps Madeline L'Engle said it best: "It will draw people to Christ by showing them a light that is so lovely that they want with all their hearts to know the source of it."

The Church Conference 2017: A More Efficient Way of Doing Our Work

This Fall our District will be using the same model as last year for Church Conference. Across the Greater New Jersey Conference the majority of congregations will be gathering for Super Saturday Church Conferences. The purpose of holding these Super Saturday Church Conferences is to:

- 1. Provide each congregation with separate space and a designated Elder to lead participants through the necessary discussion and decisions reflected in votes.
- 2. Gather 100 or more leaders and members from 10 or more congregations in worship to celebrate what God has done and is doing in our lives.
- 3. Provide several workshops to resource our ministries in several areas to strengthen vitality.

For our church, all of this will be accomplished in less than three hours on the morning of **Saturday, November 4**th at St. Peter's UMC in Ocean City.

Under this model, our Church will become partners with four other local churches. Our Church Conference will begin with registration at 9:45 – 10 am, followed by a worship and plenary session with Bishop Will Willimon from 10 am - 11:30 am. Our Church Conference begins at 11:45 am and ending at 12:30 pm at which time we will have completed all our work.
